

HSP Strategic Board 16-01-08 Item 2

Our Local Area Agreement Phase 2 (LAA2) vision is: To improve the quality of life for everyone in Havering and to “reduce the gap” that exists between some communities, age groups and individuals.

In order to reduce the gap’ the Havering Strategic Partnership has focused on :

- Raising the qualifications and skills of local residents**
- Improving the health of vulnerable communities**
- Supporting residents to live independently**
- Building a safer local environment**
- Developing resident’s sense of ownership of their local neighbourhoods, community and Havering the Place**

The HSP’s Strategic Board has decided that LAA1 targets would not be included in the 35 (or less) indicators which make up LAA2. The reason being that LAA1 would be continuing for 2 more years (until 2010) and therefore the issues highlighted under LAA1 would still be a priority for the HSP. The Strategic Board’s decision to progress partnership priorities as our Local Area Agreement Phase 2 will reflect partnership priorities rather than single organisation or process driven issues.
