

## Feedback on HSP Strategic Board LAA2 discussions: 22/11/07

Our LAA2 focuses on reducing the gap between individuals and communities in Havering.

The priorities the HSP have focused on seek to reduce the gap in prosperity of Havering residents, particularly the qualifications and skills of local residents, improve the health of vulnerable communities and vulnerable sections of our population, ensure vulnerable residents feel safe in their local environment and support residents to live independently and enhance civic pride and community cohesion ensuring that residents feel a sense of ownership of their local neighbourhoods and community .

Strategic Board reviewed the priorities and the following list is the outcome of those discussions. The Board also agreed that LAA2 targets should focus on areas of partnership activity. LAA1 targets would not be included.

#### **LAA1 targets:**

Given the lack of direction from DCLG regarding what happens with LAA1 targets, Strategic Board agreed that LAA1 targets **would not** be included in the 35 (or less) indicators which make up LAA2. The reason being that LAA1 would be continuing for 2 more years (until 2010) and therefore the issues highlighted under LAA1 would still be a priority for the HSP.

#### **Feedback on issues not going forward:**

- Arson incidents – an LAA1 target (performance details being checked by fire service/ GOL)

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- Working age population qualified to at least Level 2 or higher
- People killed or seriously injured in road traffic accidents - we're performing v. well London wide on this.
- Children killed or seriously injured in road traffic accidents - we're performing v. well London wide on this.
- Adult participation in sport - LAA1 target
- Obesity among primary school age children in Reception Year - LAA1 target
- Obesity among primary school age children in Year 6 - LAA1 target
- Children and young people's participation in high-quality PE and sport - LAA1 target
- Serious violent crime rate - LAA1 target
- Net additional homes provided - GoL do not see this as a priority for Havering
- % decent council homes - GoL do not see this as a priority for Havering
- Flood and coastal erosion risk management – The partnership does not see this as a Havering priority.
- Number of affordable homes delivered (gross) – this is a priority for the London Mayor so we don't need a specific action plan.
- Number of extended schools
- VAT registered businesses in the area showing growth – we have a joint priority with GoL regarding the VAT registration rate so can focus on that.
- Working age people on out of work benefits – in terms of reducing the gap, the Partnership preferred to focus on the target around claiming out of work benefits in the worst performing neighbourhoods.
- Take up of 14 – 19 learning diplomas – there is a lot of focus around other skills issues which are a priority for both GoL and Havering. We will soon hear if we are a pilot authority on this).
- Timeliness of social care assessment/ Timeliness of social care packages – these are process driven targets and we wish to be outcome focused. The target around 'People over 65 who say that they receive the information, assistance and support needed to exercise choice and control to live independently deals with this in a more outcome focused way.

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- CO2 reduction from Local Authority operations – in comparison to the other CO2 target, this is a Council focused outcome rather than partnership focused.

- Environment for a thriving third sector
- Average earnings of employees in the area
- Satisfaction of people over 65 with both home and neighbourhood

### **Age Concern to look to include targets around:**

- Older people and Benefits
- Older People and Skills
- Dementia
